## Paddleford River Boat Field Trip

Grades K-8 will be taking a riverboat cruise on the Mississippi River with Paddleford Riverboats of St. Paul on Wednesday, May 25. The cruise is a 45 minute trip on the Mississippi River, starting and returning from Harriet Island in St. Paul. The cruise is narrated, highlighting the history and natural beauty of the Mississippi River. The cruise begins at 12:00 pm. We will be leaving school at 10:55 for Harriet Island, where they eat lunch at Harriet Island Park (student will bring a non-microwaveable packed lunch) before boarding the riverboat. 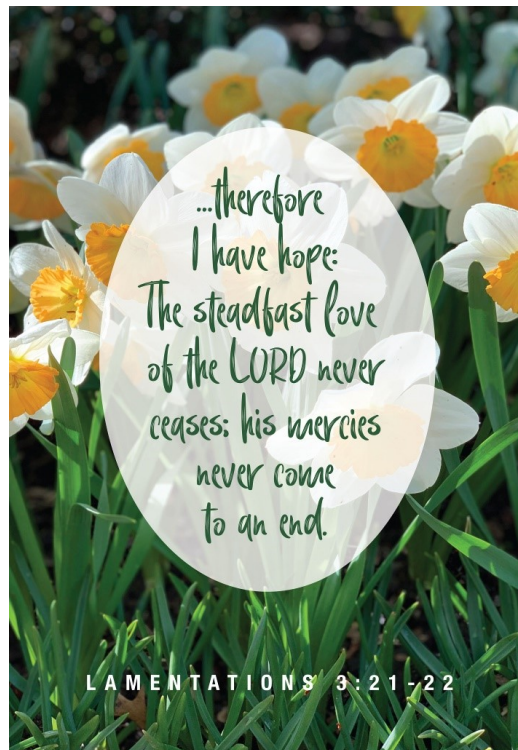
